We use certain cookies to enhance your viewing experience and to provide information concerning the type of content accessed. A cookie can identify both the user and the browser, and can be left on the user's device indefinitely. When the user's browser returns to the same website, the cookie connects with the domain and shares with it the data it has collected or stored about that user.

What are cookies?

Cookies comprise small data files, which are placed on the user's desktop computer, notebook computer or handheld device, such as a smartphone or tablet, when the individual visits a website.

There are three main types, known as first-party, second-party and third-party cookies. For the purposes of our website, we use a mixture of first-party and third-party cookies.

When you first use the Boardroom Matters website a cookie popup will appear to ask for your consent for us to use cookies. You can refuse to accept certain cookies by clicking left on the toggle switches and refusing all of the cookies apart from necessary cookies which are also known as essential cookies.

These necessary cookies are exempt from the cookie rules and do not need your consent. This is because necessary cookies help make a website usable by enabling basic functions like page navigation and access to secure areas of the website. The website cannot function properly without these cookies.

You may also be able to use the setting on your browser which allows you to refuse the setting of cookies. However, if you select this option, you may be unable to access certain parts of our website.

How we use cookies

The Boardroom Matters website uses cookies to analyse web traffic, remember you for when you next visit our website and also to provide protection from hackers.

A cookie does not give Boardroom Matters access to your device or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.
